Cooney said she was "delighted and very excited" by the announcement, which would mean the society could continue to help women who face issues such as family violence, homelessness and mental health problems. and practical support.

Ms Cooney said the site was chosen for its public transport and freeway access.

The lease on the society's current Moonee Ponds base in Shuter St, which is small and inaccessible to people with disabilities, is due to expire

Ms Cooney thanked Essendon state Labor MP Danny Pearson for helping to secure the money, for which the society has campaigned since 2013.

"If Danny hadn't helped us, I don't think this would have happened."

Mr Pearson said the Government's backing would

to raise \$300,000 towards the hub and Labor's support will make sure the Moonee Valley community has better access to family services."

The money is part of a \$1.4 million package supporting services across Melbourne.
