PARENTS of children who have outgrown nappies can donate their unused leftover packets for families in need. The Nappy Collective en-

Tower to go ahead

BUILDING PLANS APPROVED

A 16-STOREY tower has been approved at the former Moonee Ponds Market site, and councillors hope to see "stick and shovel" in the ground soon.

The proposal includes 164 apartments and two ground-

floor commercial spaces. Councillor Jim Cusack said it was a "fabulous" proposal that was "light and bright".

"The thing we're looking

for in Hall St is to create vi-brancy," Cr Cusack said. "We've got something that

might be a decent start and benchmark for what else is to come along."

Former owners Leighton Properties and Qualitas submitted the proposal then on-sold the site to Caydon Property Group earlier this

Caydon asset manager Georgia Willis welcomed the council's approval and said they were keen to get devel-



opment under way as soon

as possible.

But Ms Willis said the company was still reviewing the site's masterplan on the

the site's masterpian on the 1.34ha site.
"Any changes on the approved plans will be predicated on providing better amenity and usable spaces in the development for its residents and the local community," Ms Willis said.
