A SHORTAGE of newborn nappies is leaving a family support service unable to help vulnerable mothers.

Caroline Chisholm Society welfare case manager Janine D'Souza said the organisation was running low on donations for newborn nappies.

"We seem to have such a shortage of newborn nap-pies and with so many pregnant women coming through we just don't have the newborn nappies to give them unfortunately," Ms D'Souza said.

Those who come seeking their services are usually given 20 nappies, which is normally used up within

\$1000, which would provide them with the ability to dish out more nappies.

"If we had more nappies to "If we had more happies to give, that would be fantastic. That could go really go a long way," Ms D'Souza said. "It's really lovely to be able to give someone some-

thing tangible but there's also other issues like how you prioritise who gets what and sometimes you feel like you don't have enough to give.'
