organisation, which is run by volunteers, was currently experiencing a shortage of boys' clothing in sizes three to seven. "We can only operate if we've got the stock," she said.

"The demand coming into winter has ri-

sen.
"We don't want people to be cold, we want to help them."
Mrs Traianidis said the organisation

was also hoping to boost its number of volunteers.
"If we can get more volunteers it will allow us to expand our hours," she said.
