

From the CEO



The Caroline Chisholm Society is in a time of review and renewal. Our Strategic Plan was last fully reviewed in 2014 when we wrote a plan of what we'd be doing in 2015 to 2018. In that plan, we said we wanted to support pregnancy, children and families through our professional agency of social and community services for expectant and new mothers.

Our strategy remains to grow into three sustainable locally embedded sites in Moonee Valley, Caroline Springs and Goulburn Valley by 2025. Our new plan will continue to focus staff and volunteers on effective services, strong finances and sound governance. We will continue on our journey to being 'bigger but not too big' by 2020. We do that because we want women during pregnancy and early parenting to be empowered to create a safe and nurturing environment for their babies and toddlers. In doing so, we aim to prevent and alleviate the impacts of poverty, homelessness, family violence and issues with mental health.

Our plan for the last four years included such activities as having a fit for purpose site in Moonee Valley, funded projects in Shepparton, and continuous quality improvements in Caroline Springs through the Outcome Star, a tool we use to allow our clients to guide our work with them and measure the success of the program. As you know from our updates over these years, many of these objectives have been met. So it's time to think about what our next four years will look like.

We have several processes underway to consult on what should be included in these plans. We have recently had our Quality Review, where external reviewers interview our Board, managers, staff, volunteers, clients and colleagues. They pull our files, HR and client, to check that we do what we say we do. Then they write a report. In it, it will include some things we should consider in our new strategic plan. In addition, we have a leadership structure review underway, and a review of HR processes that occurred over the last 12 months. It's fair to say, that this is a time to have good old fashioned think. In that context, we have a transition manager in place while these reviews are underway to manage immediate issues coming up and identify the operational matters that we should consider in our strategic plan.

To date, the themes arising from the discussions include funding for our ideas (e.g. How do we create the ability to focus on it?), supporting a positive culture (e.g. How can we invest in a learning culture? How can we have more effective risk strategies and accountability?) and quality integration (e.g. How do we link our compliance work to our practice?). I anticipate that the results of the reviews will be clear in the first quarter of this year (including the response to risk) and we can spend the second focused on a service record system helping us achieve quality integration and thinking about ideas for the future for funding services.
